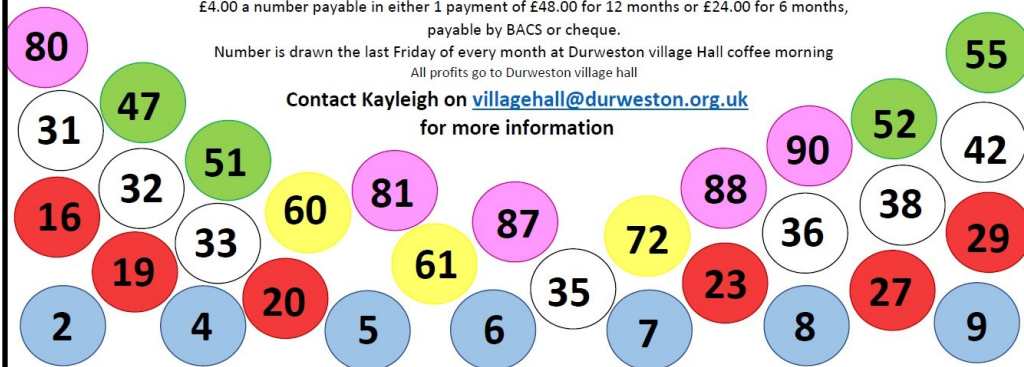

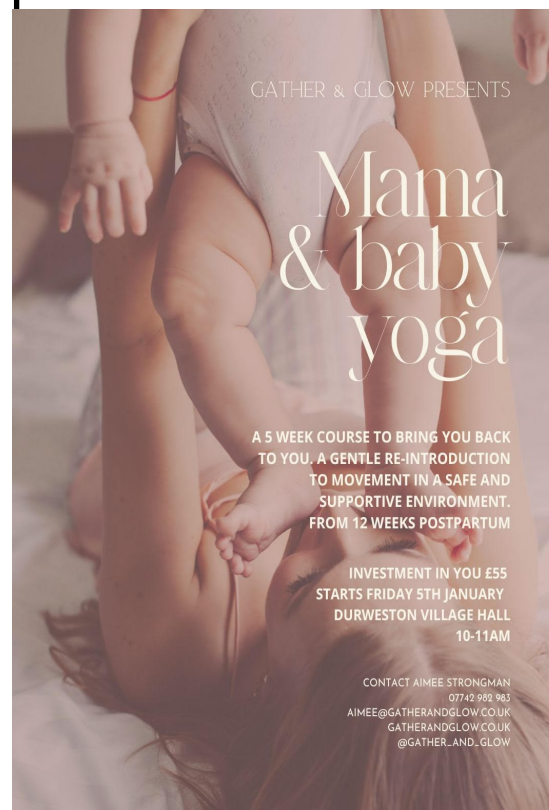

A snippet from 'View from the Hill'

Brendan has been working hard on hedge laying this winter, when the weather and cattle work has permitted. He has become very adept at laying down the old and brittle stems of the shrubs in the hedge without them snapping, as can be seen in the picture. It will be lovely to see how this leggy old hedge will look after it has put on a few months growth later in the year.

Another hedge has also been given loving care and attention, at Folly, where a very overgrown, predominantly hazel, hedge has been laid, staked, and bulked out with 'dead hedge', cut lengths which will provide protection from marauding wildlife, and at the same time protecting the new shoots that will soon be emerging. Fred and Rosie are preparing a flower garden, demarcating the site and opening it up to sunlight have now led to the purchase and planning of a polytunnel, and the planting of the first plants.

It's so wonderful catching up with our lovely local farm and what they are up to.
