THE LITTLE PAGE OF HAPPY RECIPES

..Brrrr... feeling rather cold? I am, so I feel compelled to share with you my fool proof amazing Beef Stew recipe, as old as, well as old as when Coleman's started sauces !!!

INGREDIENTS

Large pack of stewing beef (cut into chunks)
Two fresh packs of casserole vegetables prepared I buy already chopped as this is a quick fail proof recipe you could buy veggies separately if you prefer to do so. If so you will need About
3 carrots
One large onion
One turnip
One swede all cut into chunks
Some small nee potatoes
One beef casserole mix
One can of oxtail soup

METHOD

Put beef and vegetables in a large casserole pot. Add amount of water that is stated on pack to the casserole mix, stir and add to pot. Add oxtail soup Give it all a stir believe me you won't need any more liquid apart from a little water to add to soup tin to swish around and get remaining bits of soup out. Put in oven and cook for 1 hr ten mins take out after one hr ten give a stir if you feel it's still rather watery give it another ten mins without lid. Take out of oven and add dumplings if required! I just follow dumpling method on the atora box. Cook for a further 20 mins Remove from oven.. stew should be thick in consistency.

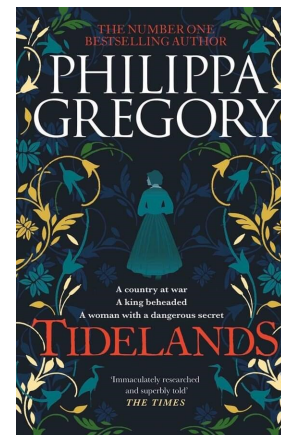

Tidelands by Philippa Gregory

Historical fiction writer, Philippa Gregory, writes this book inspired by the area of Selsey, near Chichester. It is set in 1648, amidst the civil war between the King and parliament. The main character is a woman, Alinor, who was an herbalist and midwife. The locals were aware of her linear heritage as a wise woman, which caused talk and speculation of witchcraft. The story is about Alinor's struggle with poverty, ambition, love, and her ability to heal others, in a time when witchcraft was feared, and many were put on trial.

There were mixed opinions about the book within Durweston Book Club. Philippa Gregory writes two different types of historical fiction books. Ones which I like to call "factual historical fiction" which would be based on a King or Queen (like *The Other Boleyn Girl*) and others which I call "fictional historical fiction" which are stories based in a historical time but about a made-up person. *Tidelands* falls in the fictional historical group. Philippa Gregory shows great knowledge and research in setting the scene. She is very descriptive and for some, that allowed them to be fully submersed into the story line but for others it felt repetitive and unnecessary, resulting in a frustrating read. Overall, in my opinion the best books Philippa Gregory writes are of the factual historical fiction nature; she excels in these and are a pleasure to read. This book just felt unbelievable in the circumstances and outcomes of Alinor and a bit drawn out with description. However, if you do enjoy it, it is the first book in a series so you can read more of Alinor's journey.
